Introduction:

The Lighthouse Club is delighted to present its Construction Conference 2015 on the subject of “NEC3 – Best Practice in Project Procurement and Delivery”. This Conference will concentrate on what is good about NEC3 in terms of risk allocation, collaboration, risk management and dispute avoidance and how these benefits are being achieved on the NEC contracts under construction in Hong Kong. This will be of particular interest to all those who participate in the construction industry, both in Hong Kong and elsewhere. Delegates will have a unique opportunity of learning from practitioners with many years experience in the construction industry of Hong Kong and who have seen first-hand the problems caused by adversarial relationships in conventional contracting and the benefits that can be achieved through the spirit of mutual trust and cooperation that is fostered by NEC3 and other forms of collaborative contract, thereby improving performance in project procurement and delivery. Of particular interest will be an insight into how the project team on MTR’s first NEC3 contract have adapted to this collaborative approach. This is a unique challenge for NEC3, especially when Phase 1 of this particular project was successfully implemented under MTR’s own contract form which has been in use for many years.

Conference Speakers and Topics:

- ★ **Mr. HON Chi Keung, JP, Permanent Secretary for Development (Works), Development Bureau, Works Branch and Chairman of the NEC Asia-Pacific Users’ Group** will get the conference under way with a Keynote Speech giving an update on Government’s current portfolio of NEC contracts under construction and in the course of tendering and tender preparation.
- ★ **Mr. S. M. Ho, Chief Procurement Officer of CLP Power** will give an update on the CIC Taskforce on NEC3.
- ★ **Mr. Luk Wai-hung, Chief Engineer of Drainage Services Department** will talk on the good practice adopted in the Happy Valley Underground Stormwater Storage Scheme under ECC Option C and how it brings the project to a successful phase 1 completion.
- ★ **Ms. Iris Chan, Executive Director – Construction, Hong Kong & Macau of Willis Hong Kong Limited** will outline the important role of Insurance in the management of risk under NEC3 with reference to Section 8 of the Engineering and Construction Contract.
- ★ **Mr. Damon So, Partner of Hogan Lovells** will give his views as to potential legal pitfalls in the use of NEC, particularly when introducing Z Clauses and preparation of the Works Information.
- ★ **Mr. Steve Tennant, Director of Plus Three Consultants** will explain how computer software can facilitate effective communication between all contracting parties by generating and transmitting notices, quotations, acceptances and rejections with minimal effort in a controlled environment which reduces the margin for error and provides instant feedback to all parties.
- ★ **Mr Stephen Hamill, Project Manager – WIL Civil of MTR Corporation Limited and Mr. Stanley Lo, Director and General Manager of Paul Y. Construction Company, Limited**, representing the project team of MTR Corporation and Paul Y Construction Limited engaged on MTR’s first NEC3 contract, Phase 2 of the re-provision of Kennedy Town Swimming pool, will provide an insight into the way they have adapted to the spirit of mutual trust and cooperation and the progress they have achieved so far in the delivery of this project under ECC Option A.
- ★ **Mr. Hayman Choi, Divisional Director, Mott MacDonald Hong Kong Limited** will outline the “beauty” of the use of target cost contract options under NEC3 Engineering and Construction Contract and express views over some key practicalities required to be properly addressed to help visualize the “beauty”.
- ★ **Mr. Robert Pegg, Consultant Director of Battersby Kingsfield Limited** will review the flexible procurement options available under NEC3’s Engineering and Construction Contract, Sub-Contract and Professional Services Contract providing opportunities for Employers, Consultants, Contractors and Subcontractors to achieve best value in managing design and construction risks and delivering projects effectively and economically.
- ★ Project experiences and views as to the success of NEC3 in achieving best practice in project procurement and delivery in terms of risk allocation, collaboration, risk management and dispute avoidance will also be provided by experienced practitioners and debated in the panel discussion at the end of the conference.
